Lent 2025 Midweek Wednesday Series



Theme: "Jesus Tells Why He Must Suffer..."

The willingness of Jesus Christ to suffer is a central theme in our Christian faith, reflecting His obedience to the Father and His love for humanity. This willingness is evident throughout the New Testament and is foundational to the understanding of His redemptive work. His suffering was purposeful, aimed at reconciling humanity to God and providing a model of faithful endurance for us today.

In 1 Peter 2:21, believers are reminded, "For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in His footsteps."

Jesus' example encourages believers to embrace suffering for the sake of righteousness, trusting in God's ultimate plan and purpose. My hope for this series is that the days and weeks of Lent call us to keep the focus of our lives of faith on Jesus, our Lord, to learn more of Him and His loving plan of salvation for us so that we may come to Easter with glad hearts.

A classic hymn named "On My Heart Imprint Your Image" LSB 422 portrays that proper focus in this petition to the Lord:

On my heart imprint Your image, Blessed Jesus, King of grace, That life's riches, cares, and pleasures Never may Your work erase; Let the clear inscription be: Jesus, crucified for me, Is my life, my hope's foundation, And my glory and salvation! —LSB 422
